# DO NOT RECYCLE:

## NO HARDBACK BOOKS, FROZEN FOOD OR FOOD-CONTAMINATED BOXES



## NO PLASTIC PAILS, TUBS, TRAYS, FOOD CONTAINERS OR FOIL ITEMS

**IMPORTANT:** The recycle symbol & number do **NOT** always mean that we can recycle a plastic item. **DO NOT RECYCLE #1 & #2 TUBS AND TRAYS AND ANY #3 THRU #7 PLASTICS.**

We must sort these items out at the recycling center and send them to the landfill.



## NO MUGS, GLASSES, VASES, BULBS, BAKEWARE, DISHES OR WINDOW GLASS



## NO PLASTIC, STYROFOAM, LIDS OR CAPS



## NO MOTOR OIL, LUBRICANTS, PAINT OR PESTICIDE CONTAINERS



# NO PLASTIC BAGS

They jam up our sorting equipment. Recycle them at grocery stores instead.



# HOW TO RECYCLE:

## PAPER

PUT IN PAPER BAGS OR BUNDLE IT

## CARDBOARD

MIX WITH PAPER  
FLATTEN BOXES  
REMOVE STYROFOAM, PLASTIC AND WOOD



Put recycling in **PROPER CONTAINERS** in your recycling dropoff area

## BOTTLES, CANS AND BEVERAGE, SOUP & SAUCE CARTONS

LABELS ARE OKAY  
**NO CAPS OR LIDS**  
**DO NOT USE PLASTIC BAGS**
